<b>Basic Korean</b>	
<b>Main Textbook</b>	서강한국어 1A (Korean for Foreigners), Sogang University
<b>Time</b>	30 hours (3hours a day)
<b>Course Description</b>	<p>This class is for students who are just starting to study Korean. Starting with learning Hangeul (Korean Alphabet). Aims for students to understand the Korean alphabet and speak basic Korean needed on a daily basis</p> <p>This course covers the basic grammatical structures and vocabularies necessary for basic conversation, reading comprehension, and writing sentences to help the students build a solid foundation for further study in Korean language.</p>
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<p>Students are expected</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To be able to communicate with native speakers of the Korean language in their lives.</li> <li>2. To be able to introduce themselves and another person.</li> <li>3. To be able to talk about the location and numbers in Korean.</li> <li>4. To be able to order in a cafeteria and buy things in a store.</li> <li>5. To be able to talk about daily routines and life using present and past tense.</li> </ol>
<p>* This course is for students who beginning to learn Korean as a foreign language.</p>

<b>Intermediate Korean</b>	
<b>Main Textbook</b>	서강한국어 2A or 2B, Sogang University (This may vary depending on the class.)
<b>Time</b>	30 hours (3hours a day)
<b>Course Description</b>	<p>This class is designed for students who can speak basic Korean language. This course is student-centered and focuses on improving speaking abilities through a variety of realistic communicative activities. Students are able to improve their ability to speak quickly by learning vocabulary and used in daily life while engaging in very realistic activities.</p> <p>Students will have an opportunity to understand intermediate Korean language and Korean culture.</p> <p><b>This class is designed for students who have studied Korean over three months or the equivalent training in basic level language ability of reading, writing, listening, and speaking.</b></p>
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<p>Students are expected</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To be able to perform communication necessary for daily life and understand Korean culture.</li> <li>2. To be able to improve interactive speaking ability</li> <li>3. To be able to make formal requests and refusals and to discern between and practice formal and informal ways of saying things using appropriate words and phrases in relatively simple situations.</li> <li>4. To be able to read and write on daily or social issues and understand and enjoy Korean literature while becoming more intimate with the Korean perspective.</li> </ol>
<p><b>* This class is available to students who have studied Korean for three months or Who pass the TOPIK 1 level can take the class or Who understand past and future tense in Korean.</b></p>

<b>Advanced Korean</b>	
<b>Main Textbook</b>	서강한국어 3 or 4, Sogang University (This may vary depending on the class.)
<b>Time</b>	30 hours (3hours a day)
<b>Course Description</b>	<p>This class is designed for students who have taken intermediate Korean courses or the equivalent training in Topik4 level language ability of reading, writing, listening, and speaking in Korean.</p> <p>Students will observe various types of cultural issues in Korea and discuss them.</p> <p>Aims to prepare students for successful academic pursuits in undergraduate courses by practicing presentation, discussion, essay writing, and note taking in Korean.</p>
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<p>Students are expected</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To be able to actively participate in discussions and debates for academic outcomes and learn how to present pros and cons, make assumptions, criticize, contradict, and support their opinion with appropriate evidences.</li> <li>2. To be able to be trained how to present, sharpen their analytical skills, and engage in peer-critique sessions so that they become better presenters.</li> <li>3. To be able read and understand writing on varied topics related to required coursework, deliver their ideas in different situations, and write reports using appropriate academic conventions and logic.</li> </ol>
